GREEN INSIDE AND OUT GUIDE TO RECYCLING ON LONG ISLAND



Do you want to know what you can recycle on Long Island? Confused about what your Town accepts or doesn't accept?

Currently about half of LI's waste is incinerated, 40% is trucked to landfills off LI, and ~10% is recycled - which is about 1/3 of the national recycling rate. This easy guide helps us to recycle properly.

Note that plastic containers should be marked with a number from 1 to 7 within a triangular recycling symbol, to identify which type of plastic it is.

Recycling saves energy and makes wiser use of resources by avoiding the need to collect new raw materials. Our recyclables get made into insulation, paint cans, carpet, cardboard, and more -



 - Plastic bags can be brought to stores to be recycled

- Glass bin: Clean glass, bottles & jars
- Metal & plastic bin: Plastic #1 & 2, water/soda bottles, tin, aluminum & bi-metallic cans, aerosol spray cans



- No light bulbs, mirrors, crystal, window panes, plate glass, stemware, ceramic
- No soiled cardboard
- No styrofoam or toxic chemicals
- No plastic bags or hangers
- No waxed, metallic, shredded or soiled paper
